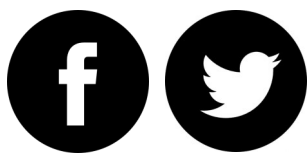
CHAIR'S CHALLENGE

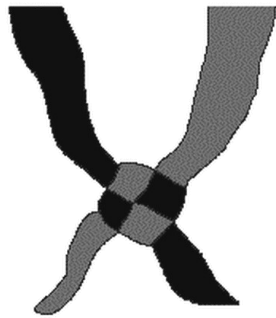

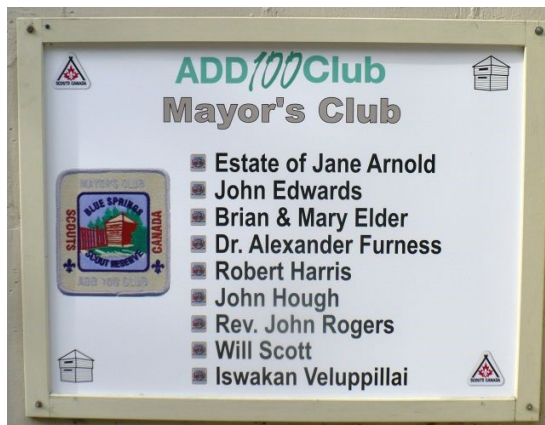


MYSTERY SOLVED!

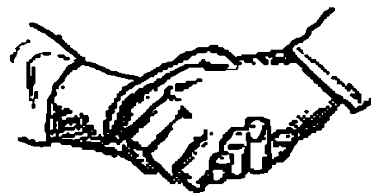

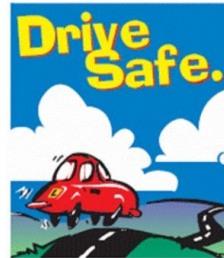

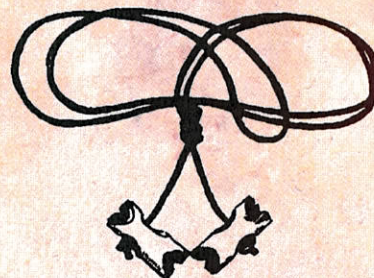
